TEACHER'S PENCIL ORGANIZER INSTRUCTIONS

SUPPLIES AND TOOLS NEEDED:

- 1 Felt Creative Cuts package – color of your choice
- 3 Pieces of scrap felt or fabric - color of choice for the Apple
- Iron on applique (Small Butterfly) – optional
- Embroidery Floss
- Marking Pencil
- Basic sewing supplies

Cutting Instructions:

- Cut 2 - 11" x 7" from Felt Creative Cuts = Inside and Outside Cover
- Cut 1 – 11" x 4" from Felt Creative Cuts = Pencil Holder
- Cut 1 - Apple
- Cut 1 – Leaf
- Cut 1 – Steam



Directions:

1. Outside Cover – Fold in half and find front center and mark.
2. Apple – Center the apple on the front Outside Cover, whipstitch in place.
3. Steam – Center the steam at the top of the apple as indicated in the pattern; whipstitch in place.
4. Leaf – Place the leaf on the steam and Whipstitch in place detail the center of leaf.
5. Butterfly – Following instructions on package press in place.
6. Pencil Holder – Place the pencil holder at the bottom of the inside cover, pin in place, draw a line every 1" across and stitch using a Running stitch.
7. Place Inside and Outside Covers wrong sides together; secure with safety pins at each corner, stitch around outside perimeter using a Blanket stitch.

Stitch Directions:

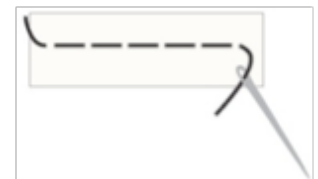
Blanket stitch:

Begin at the left-hand side of the work, securing the thread with two or three very small running stitches on the wrong side of the fabric about one-eighth of an inch above the edge. Insert the needle to the depth desired, drawing it up from under the fabric and over the thread, allowing the thread to form a loop beneath the needle and along the edge of the fabric. Place the needle a little distance from the first stitch and make the second stitch in exactly the same way.



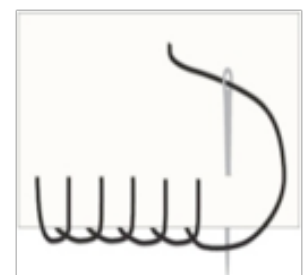
Whipstitch:

Insert the threaded needle into the wrong side of fabric, so that it comes out the right side of the second piece. Loop the needle around over the top of where the two pieces come together and again push the needle into the wrong side of the first piece of fabric, through the second, and out. Continue to stitch in this manner for the length of the seam.



Running Stitch:

Bring your thread up through the front on the right hand side of the line to be stitched. Take a small stitch, skimming your needle underneath the fabric along the line. Pull your thread through, and then take another stitch. Keep both the stitch length and the space in between the same each time.
